

Death Calls Miguel Etchart, 70, to Rest

Member of one of the first French families to settle in this section, Miguel Etchart, South Grove avenue rancher, died Wednesday evening at 9 o'clock at the ranch home. He had been a resident of the Chino district for nearly 30 years and prior to that time had been a shepherd in the area between Los Angeles and Ontario when the area was still undeveloped.

Born in France 70 years, 6 months and 29 days prior to death, Mr. Etchart came to the United States 49 years ago. His wife died here in 1921 and his remains will be laid to rest by her side in Holy Cross cemetery, Pomona, following funeral services tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock. Rosary service will be held this evening at the K. T. Heinauer mortuary with Rev. Fr. C. A. Kimmons of Our Lady of Guadalupe church officiating.

Surviving are a daughter, Jennie, and a son, John, both at home, and five sisters, four of whom live in California and one still in France.
