August 8, 1918 - March 27, 2011 Charles was born in San Francisco, to Joseph J. and Nellie Murphy Johnston, the third of six children. The family moved to Taft to find work in the oil fields. Charles had fond memories of spending many summers camping in Yosemite. He attended Taft schools, and upon graduation from Taft Jr. College joined the Gas Company, but worked there for only two years before war broke out. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1941, rising to the rank of Lieutenant and serving as a Flight Engineer and backup Pilot for a B-29 Superfortress. This was followed by a few years as a test pilot until 1946, when he left the service and joined Southern California Edison, working there as a service crew foreman in Pomona until his retirement in 1981. "Charlie" married Marie Coudures of Perris in 1948, moved to Ventura, and finally to Pomona in 1956, where they built their lives and their family with their children, Katie (born 1952) and Chuck (born 1956). On Sunday, March 27, 2011, Charles F. Johnston passed away in Claremont, CA. He is survived by his wife, Marie; his son, Chuck and his wife, Rose Thommen of Chino Hills; his granddaughter, Mikela Oberg and her husband, Bryan of Bakersfield; his brother, Joe Johnston; and his sister, Margaret Wangberg of Newport Beach, as well as his sisters in law, Louise Martin of Perris, Darlene Johnston of Goleta, Velda Johnston of Maricopa; son in law, Alejandro Bernal of Bakersfield; and many nephews and nieces.
