

**SAN DIEGO PIONEER DIES.**

**Ramona Rancher Succumbs to Illness at Ocean Park, Where He Had Gone Seeking Health.**

OCEAN PARK, Oct. 6.—Bernard Etcheverry, aged 76, a pioneer rancher of Ramona, San Diego county, died at No 115 Hart avenue, last night. He had been staying here for the last two weeks in the hope that the sea air would benefit his falling health. He leaves a valuable estate, including 800 acres of fertile land near Ramona. A widow and four children survive. Prof. Bernard Etcheverry, instructor in civil engineering and irrigation at the University of California, for the last ten years, Dr. Michel E. Etcheverry, of San Francisco, Fred J. Etcheverry of Ramona, and Mrs. Lucien Rouvet of San Diego are the sons and daughter. Etcheverry came to California over twenty years ago and fifteen years ago bought a ranch at Ramona, taking up grape culture, which proved highly profitable. The family is well-known throughout the county of San Diego. The body was shipped to Ramona by O. A. Kirkelle, undertaker, this afternoon.
